Jesus Dies and Rises from the Dead

In Jesus' day, they would bury bodies with ointments and spices to cover up the smell of death. but Jesus rose from the dead, and then He ascended into heaven where there is no death, only life. Here's part of that story . . .

After these things Joseph of Arimathea . . . asked Pilate that he might take away the body of Jesus . . . Nicodemus also . . . came bringing a mixture of myrrh and aloes, about seventy-five pounds in weight. So they took the body of Jesus and bound it in linen cloths with the spices, as is the burial custom of the Jews.
